

Captured at Waukegan

A full grown opossum, an animal considered as very rare in this part of the country, captured in traps set on his property by W. I. Lyon, of Waukegan, president of the American Bird Banding association and noted as a naturalist, has been turned over to the department of Zoology of the Chicago Academy of sciences and has been placed in the museum of that department in Lincoln Park.

The animal is the first to be caught in this section and is the only one that will be on display in this museum which is devoted solely to exhibits of wild game life in the Chicago Area. Waukegan is in what is known to scientists in this section as the "Chicago arna, north."
