Things to Cook

If there is someone you wish to remember at Christmas time with something that requires a little personal effort, or if you would like something suggest some fancy, decorated cook-

Quite a variety of these lovely little cookies may be made by using one recipe for White Cookies, using a number of different cutters, with a different treatment or decoration for each shape. The following recipe will be found very satisfactory and will keep for several weeks.

White Cookies

1 cup butter

cup sugar 2 eggs well beaten

½ teaspoon salt

2 tablespoons sweet cream 2 teaspoons baking powder

teaspoon flavoring

Cake flour to make stiff enough to

Before rolling any of them, add to a little of the dough a few finely chop- Fur Coats for Women ped nuts, to another portion a few chopped candied cherries and to another portion a little chopped candied pineapple, sprinkling a little granulated sugar over the tops and cutting each kind with a different cutter.

A few may be made plain, sprinkling with a little sugar and placing a slice of blanched almond in the center; another shape may have chopped pistachio nuts sprinkled over the top and another chopped almonds. For other shaped cutters I use for decoration tiny strips of angelica, of candied pineapple, of almond, bits of candier cherries cut in any desired shapes, also some of the delicate colored gum drops cut in tiny strips or other dainty shapes.

By giving a little thought to planning the decoration, having all materials cut and ready before mixing the cookies, any number of attractive variations may be made and the result will boxwell worth the effort?

A pleasing addition to these cookies will be some very rich cookies, called Butter Cakes or Butter Cookies, using the same recipe except that one and one-half cups of butter should be used instead of one cup, and making them of the consistency to use with a pastry tube or cookie press, pressing them out in fancy shapes. I find a temperature of 375 very satisfactory for all.

Cost Chicagoans Over \$12,000,000 in Year

Mr. Chicago will have to dig down in his jeans and produce at least \$12,-000,000 to supply Mrs. Chicago and the equally fastidious Misses Chicago with their requirements in fur coats and neck pieces for the coming winter, according to the Chicago Association of Commerce.

This very respectable outlay for fox, squirrel, mink, sable and other furry luxuries represents only the retail purchases to be made in the city and is in addition to the \$18,000,000 that will swell the coffers of Chicago's manufacturing furriers and the \$12,000,000 that will go to its wholesalers.

Of the twelve million to be divided among the retailers, about 50 per cent will be spent in the department stores, with the 210 independent fur shops operating in Chicago taking the other half.

The small part that fur trimmings play in the wardrobe of Mr. Chicago is shown by the fact that in recent years annual sales of skins for men's wear in the city have totalled less than \$100,000.
