As the close of the second week of the thirteenth annual Roll Call of the American Red Cross, James B. Forgan, Jr., chairman of Chicago chapter, today reported that the financial returns are running abreast with last year and if this condition continues there is every reason to believe that the goal of \$200,000 will be reached.
