N. S. LINE EXTENDS AIR-RAIL SERVICE

New Connection Enlarges Scope of This Type of Travel East and South

Extension of its rail-air connections is announced by the Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee railroad (North Shore Line) with completion of arrangements with the Embry-Riddle company in Chicago whereby travel time is reduced between north shore cities and Indianapolis, Cincinnati and other points in the east and south.

This is the third rail-air hook-up made by the North Shore Line this year. Connecting service with the South Air lines brought Detroit, Cleveland and other eastern cities several hours nearer points on the North Shore Line, while a hook-up with the Universal Air Lines system established direct service to Kansas City, St. Louis, Cleveland, New York, Boston, Los Angeles, San Diego and other leading points throughout the country.

New Arrangement

Under the new arrangement with the Embry-Riddle company, travel time between Milwaukee and Cincinnati is cut to six hours, while the journey to Indianapolis is made in four hours and 45 minutes. Corresponding reductions are made in the time between these cities and other points served by the North Shore Line.

Two trips are made daily in each direction under the new hook-up. The traveler boards a North Shore Line limited proceeding over the Skokie Valley route to Roosevelt road station in Chicago. Here he transfers to a special motor coach which transports him directly to the Municipal Airport, where the plane is boarded for the trip to his destination.

Alternative Route for Highway No. 173 Is Reported Favored

R. M. Lobdell, county superintendent of highways, last week submitted the alternative route for Highway 173 between Channel lake and Antioch to residents in that section.

A large number of the property owners were present but a number failed to attend the conference. Those attending expressed themselves as more pleased with the alternative route than the one offered originally by the state highway department.

Mr. Lobdell turned the blue prints and maps over to Supervisor William Rosing of Antioch, to clean up the preliminary work in getting the road accepted and the right-of-way pledged. The state will not bother with the road unless it gets complete right-of-way.

As soon as Mr. Rosing finishes his task the flue prints will be turned back to the county superintendent to take the matter up with the state department again.
