Legion Posts Warned of Man Said to Carry Fraudulent Credentials

Lake county American Legion officials have information that a man posing as Edward L. Daley and carrying a 1929 card in the Bryan, Ohio, Post No. 81, card No. 973804, dated April 15, 1929, has forged credentials, according to the Legion Bulletin, which says:

"His real name is Edward L. Hinck. He entered the service from Cleveland, saw service overseas but was dishonorably discharged and is, therefore, not eligible for membership in the American Legion. He has been traveling about the country for a year or more swindling Legion posts with forged credentials. On September 27th he was in Rantoul, Ill., and worked the Rantoul Post No. 287 for ten dollars. He was in a car at that time traveling with his family.

Fines Collected by States Attorney's Office

Fines collected by his office between Sept. 10 and Nov. 13 amounted to \$6,033.50, States Attorney A. V. Smith this week reported to Circuit Judge Claire C. Edwards.

The fines since Col. Smith took office Dec. 6, 1920, amount to \$450,752.60.

In that time he has sent 268 men and women to the county jail for various vices.

This figure does not include the convicts sent to penal institutions.

Trying to Plug Leak in Hospital Expenses

In order to eliminate one more leak in the expenses at the county hospital, the hospital committee and the states attorney's office are laying plans to sue all emergency patients for bills owed the institution, it is reported.

An indication of the indebtedness contracted by emergency patients can be seen in the records for the past 60 days, which show \$500 as uncollected.
