The average estimated true value per acre of land in Lake county as of April 1st, 1929, is placed at \$291.00 by R. A. Miller, tax commissioner of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway company, who has just completed a report on the land values of all the counties through which the railroad owns trackage.

The survey, which covers the period from January, 1923 to September, 1929, establishes the fact that 19,965 acres of land was sold during that period, at an average sale price of \$247.53 per acre. The total number for the year 1928 was \$94.75
