

Bring 10,000 Children to See Chicago Sights

Educational tours conducted by the Chicago & Alton railroad enabled 10,000 children in Illinois to see the sights of Chicago during the past summer, according to announcement by S. C. Lutz, president of the road. Most of the children were from rural districts and small towns and were accompanied by teachers, parents or school officials. The loop, stockyards, Field museum, Art institute, were among the places visited.
