**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF TAXI-CABS AND FIXING THE LOCATION OF TAXI-CAB STANDS IN THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, ILLINOIS. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:**

**SECTION 1.** That Sections Five (5) and Seventeen (17) of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF TAXI-CABS AND FIXING THE LOCATION OF TAXI-CAB STANDS IN THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, ILLINOIS" shall be and the same are hereby amended to read as follows:

**"SECTION 5.** The following license fees shall be paid: Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for the first cab and Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each additional cab, which license fees shall be in addition to any fees heretofore established. In the case of licenses issued on or after November 1st in each year hereafter one-half only of the above shall be paid."

**"SECTION 17.** That any licensed public passenger vehicle, complying with the terms of the ordinance of the City of Highland Park and the laws of the State of Illinois, may stand on Central Avenue between the Chicago North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad Company tracks and the Chicago and North Western Railway Company tracks and on any other public street or alley while waiting for employment, such parking to be diagonally to the curb on the both sides of said Central Avenue in a line of single cars, provided however, that no more than ten taxicabs shall be allowed to park in such space at any one time and not more than three cabs owned or operated by the same company shall be allowed to park in said stand at the same time."

**SECTION II.** This ordinance shall be in full force after its passage, approval and publication, in accordance with the law.
