Naval Recruits Given Chance to Train for Aviation Department

The Navy recruiting station Chicago, Illinois, announces that new men sent to the training school at Great Lakes, Ill., five men are selected each week for aviation training. This is an opportunity that will behoove any young American to grasp when consideration is given the fact that naval aviation training is the most comprehensive course of air work in the country. It is easily seen that a young man can very well go wrong in trying for the best school for his aviation training. When a young man is graduated from the naval aviation pilots class at Pensacola, Fla., he is a finished aviator.

The pilots class at Pensacola, Fla., is the final stage of a year and a half of aviation preparatory work. Since November 1 the Chicago recruiting office has been allowed to enlist men per month, an increase of 500 over the old allowance. This gives an increased number of young men in the Chicago area the opportunity to better themselves by traveling by the splendid training offered in Navy trade schools.

Men who are unsuccessful in their attempt to obtain aviation training still have an excellent opportunity in the Navy. Fifty-five trades are taught in as many trade schools. Any ambitious young man can enter himself mentally in the Navy. Travel as well as advancement in this particularly attractive.
