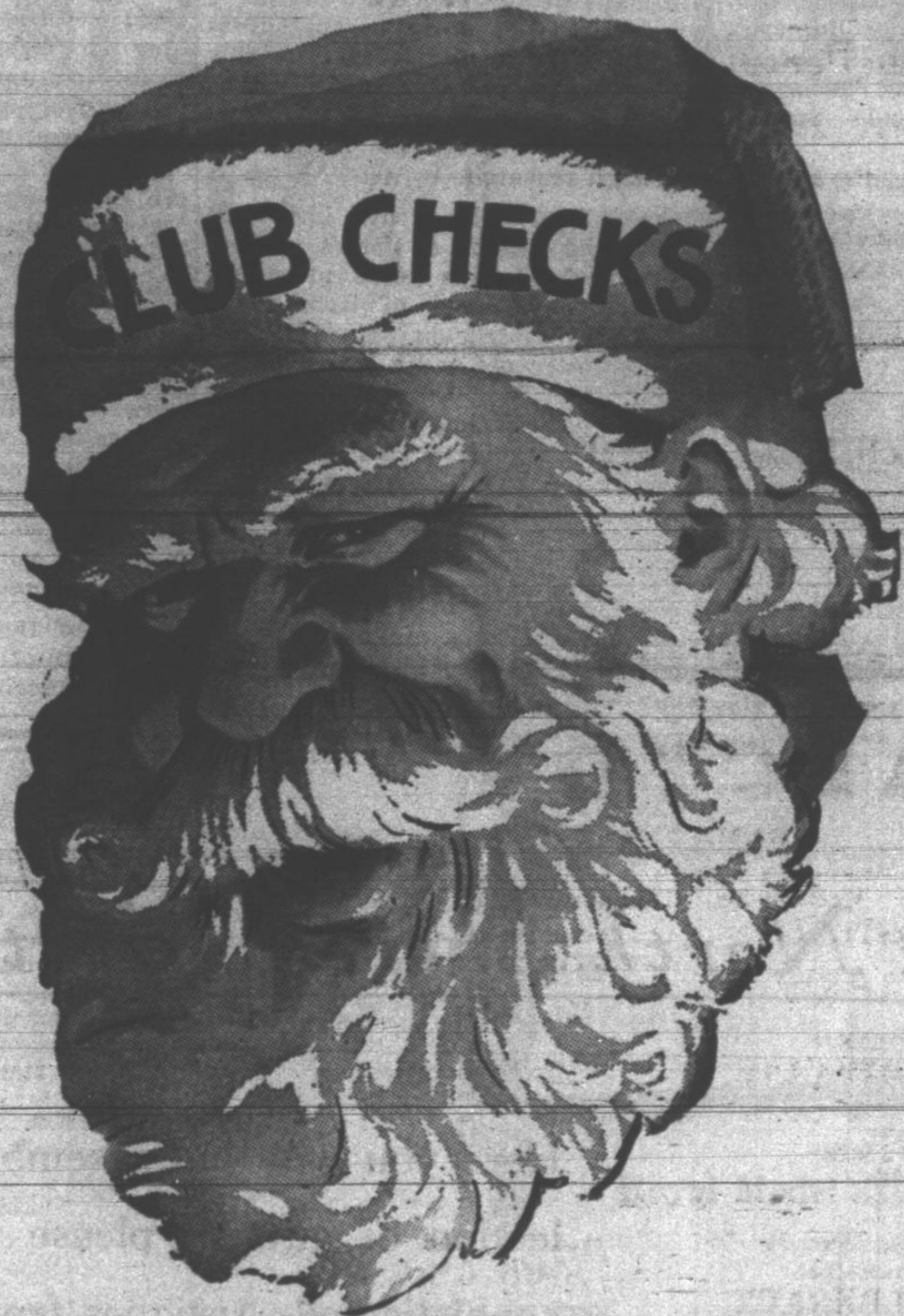
**Advice Issued to
Veterans Intending
to Visit Big Cities**

At this time of the year, when the
agricultural sections release some of
their man power for a few months,
there usually is an influx of men to
the larger cities to find employment
to fill in the winter months. Many
of these men are veterans of the
World war, who expect work to be
found immediately through the aid

of American Legion officers in the
cities.
Word received at national head-
quarters of the Legion here indicates
the usual winter movement toward
the cities, and that seemingly little
thought is given by these men to the
possibility of not finding employment
before their funds are depleted, and
no provision made to care for them-
selves while seeking work.
Such veterans who wish to hunt
winter employment in the cities are
advised by the Legion that they

should first inquire of the city's
chamber of commerce whether work
of the kind they can do is likely to
be available, as cold weather inter-
rupts building operations and often
affects other kind of employment.
Sufficient funds should be provided
to carry a man over until employment
is found, or for return fare, unless
work is first assured, or one has per-
sonal friends with whom he can stay.
