

Gorgeous Pageant, Ball and Athletic Carnival Planned

A gorgeous costume pageant and ball, with a midnight athletic carnival, limited to American Legion and Auxiliary membership workers, will be held at the next national convention of the Legion and Auxiliary in Boston as a spectacular climax at night to the big parade, according to an announcement received from national headquarters of the Legion in Indianapolis. A dozen bands will furnish dance music. Upward of 100 drum and bugle corps will herald the grand march at the ball. Cash prizes will be awarded the best costumes.

Illinois, which now stands 20th among the department in Legion membership, has a chance, if it increases its membership efforts, to receive some of the tickets December 31, when the Legion will hold a national roll call of departments by telegraph. Fifty-five tickets, or vouchers for tickets, will be awarded by the Legion and 55 by the Auxiliary at that time, the Auxiliary awards depending on the standing of the Auxiliary departments, alone.

The tickets to the floor of the ball will be difficult to obtain. Each ticket will be good for one couple. They will be awarded only to Legion or Auxiliary membership workers and winners. The only other way to get one will be to buy it from a winner, at an estimated auction price of \$100 or more.

The Legion and Auxiliary contests are separate, but alike. The ten departments in each organization hav-

ing the highest percentage of their quotas December 31 will receive 55 tickets divided up so the highest one in each organization will receive ten tickets, the next highest nine, etc. The departments, in turn, will pass the tickets, the next highest nine, etc. The the highest standing, and the posts will dispose of the tickets in any manner they see fit, so long as they are used as membership awards.

Many other high honors with cash prizes of \$100, \$75 and \$50 to departments are planned in connection with the race for the tickets. Details are being worked out so that in the big parade there will be three chariots, one gold, one silver, and one bronze, in which will ride highest winners, Zeus for the Legion, Hera for the Auxiliary, two Heirs Apparent and two Pretenders. These six winners will be veiled until the ball.

No tickets to the pageant and carnival, where the high winners will hold court amidst unprecedented splendor, will be allowed a department after December 31 until it reaches its membership quota. Early records in membership will count all down the line in obtaining tickets. Winning departments will be allowed the honor of naming the high principals.

Income Tax Returns on Forms 1096, 1099 to Be Filed Earlier

In accordance with the provisions of Treasury Decision No. 4277, received by Mrs. Myrtle Tanner Blackledge, collector of Internal Revenue, First District of Illinois, all information Forms 1096 and 1099 will in future be filed with collectors of Internal Revenue on or before February 15 of the year following that in which payments are made, instead of with the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, Washington, D.C., or before March 15, as heretofore, according to a notice from the collectors office.

This is a distinct departure from previous procedure and all persons preparing these forms are requested to carefully read the instructions contained thereon before completing them. It is imperative that the change be carefully observed by all those who are required under the law to file this class of information.

This applies only to those paying salaries or dividends, according to interpretation of Chicago newspapers.
