Highwood Woman Is Awakened by Robber in House; Other Cases

Awakened at 3:45 last Thursday morning by a noise in her bedroom, Mrs. David Olsen of Highwood screamed when she saw a man fumbling at the dresser drawer and as she screamed the burglar ran out without obtaining any loot, but a man believed to be the same burglar, had previously got \$60 in cash from the home of Dr. N. C. Risjord on Michigan avenue in Highwood.

Chief of Police Henderson of Highwood, who investigated the case, found that the burglar had broken in the rear door at the Risjord home, stealthily entered the bedroom where Dr. Risjord was sleeping and grabbed the physician's trousers. They were found as soon as it was daylight in the yard next to the Risjord residence, but the \$60 in cash was missing from his pocket.

At the Olsen residence the burglar gained entrance in the same manner, and had apparently gone direct to the bedroom where Mrs. Olsen was sleeping. He fumbling about the dresser, had made a slight noise which awakened her and he ran out without getting any valuables.

New Bootleg Racket Reported in Glencoe

Residents of all north shore cities are warned of a new racket that has been worked by a bootlegger at Glencoe and nearby communities. This man pretends to sell five gallon cans of the best alcohol for \$35 but his victims have found that a one quart can containing alcohol has been soldered into the top of the big can, just under the cork. The rest of the five gallon can contains water. Police of several north shore towns are seeking to locate the imposter.
