Report Spurious Bonds Afloat in Barrington Village Audit; Search

Duplication of at least two public improvement bonds issued by the Village of Barrington has made it necessary for the village officials to order a complete audit of improvement bonds according to an admission made last week by Mayor John Cadwallader.

"The bonds were for \$500 or \$1,000. I have forgotten which, he declared in denying the rumor from Barrington that \$18,000 in spurious paper was afloat.

The bonds could have reached the market through error, the mayor pointed out. He explained that it would have been a simple matter for some one to have tampered with the get for the 12 months period. so that the same serial number would appear on more than one bond.

"We don't know that this is what happened. It could have been done this way," he explained.

Lake county last week completed its first quarter of the fiscal year with \$366,900 of its \$501,175 appropriation unspent.
