CIRCUIT THEATRE, NEW NAME CHOSEN

York Theatre guild is doing the Circuit theatre a very distinct good turn. The New York organization controls the acting rights to a great many good plays, plays which the local play-reading committee has often considered and several times chosen, plays most of which have been on the "taboo" list of the Circuit theatre simply because they were unobtainable. Among the plays controlled by the Theatre guild are many such as "Porgy," "Wings over Europe," "Volpone" and "He Who Gets Slapped," and the entire works of some authors such as Bernard Shaw and Eugene O'Neill. And now, for a period of years, the Circuit Theatre association is to have prior rights for production from Chicago through Lake Forest on all New York Theatre guild plays which they have released for amateur production. It is in accord with this that the Circuit Theatre presented Shaw's "The Devil's Disciple," and that some of the plans for the future are able to exist. This agreement opens the way for the production of many excellent plays which will be of great interest to the north shore little theatre audiences.

Contest Near Close

And as word from one of the activities outside of the production of amateur plays for the north shore territory, the Circuit theatre is announcing the approaching close of the 1929 one-act play writing contest which it

annually conducts in Illinois. This is a state division of the national contest which is sponsored by Longmans, Green and Company, and the Drama League of America, and it offers production and publication of the winning play. Entries for the 1929 contest must be one-act in construction and one a theme which is applicable to Christmas. They must be mailed to John Allen Stewart, 716 Foster street, Evanston, not later than Dec. 31. All plays will be read and judged by a committee of the Circuit Theatre association, and the Illinois winners will be announced on Feb. 15.

The Circuit theatre season includes the production of three more plays, one in January, March and May, each of which will be presented on the regular circuit of six towns. Complete information about the organization and its activities will be sent on request to the studio in Evanston, Ill.

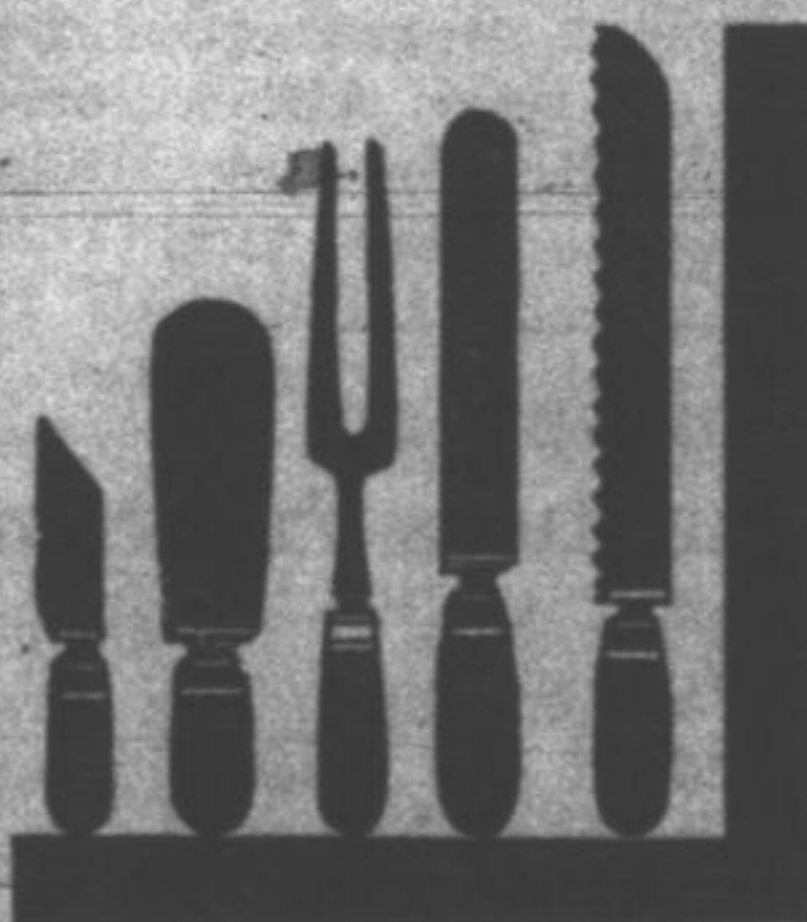
