Dudley Crafts Watson in Many Talks on Art to Chicago Schools

No one who has not seen the interest and enthusiasm in the public school children of Chicago, by the appearance before them of Dudley Crafts Watson in his talks on art, can for a moment appreciate what an important and significant task he is doing. It is all due to the James Nelson Raymond public school children's lecture fund, which maintains this remarkable work. It is the only department of its kind in the United States.

Mr. Watson during 1928 gave 155 talks, all of them illustrated with crayons or slides, to 68,134 children in Cook county. Two lectures are given to the school children each week in Fullerton hall, Art Institute, one on Mondays at 4:00 p. m. to high school students and the other on Saturdays, at 2:45 to grammar school students. Mr. Watson has the gift of enlisting the youngsters' attention from the first, using similies of a practical kind to illustrate his point.

It was a revelation to a visitor who was present at one of these talks at the Harper high school, on the south side, recently. The auditorium was filled with senior high school students. The speaker with crayon and large gave the program of old and sheets of paper, gave easily understood directions of how to compose pictures and how not to compose them. He showed them how every tree had a different growth of branch and twig, where the center of interest should be placed, and the horizon line drawn for a landscape or a marine. He called on the assemblage to select a subject for him to draw and amid such enthusiasm the students called out their football captain who gamely faced the crayon.

These lectures, through the operation of the James Nelson Raymond fund are giving the children of Cook county a real taste for art.
