Extensive Improvements to Be Made by Government; Chindblom Aiding

Extensive changes in the original plan of improvement of the Waukegan harbor which will result in greatly enlarging the size of the harbor as well as affording greater protection to the waterway from the vagaries of the elements was recommended by Congressman Carl R. Chindblom in a conference with the committee on rivers and harbors of congress who in turn reported on the advisability of the plan. The plan provides for an expenditure of more than \$400,000 it is believed.

The recommendations now being considered by the rivers and harbors committee provides for extension of the west end of the south pier to a point about 500 feet south and the construction of a second breakwater which will be located south of the entrance to the harbor.

Part of Big Project

These improvements are to be done in connection with the building of an extension to the present breakwater north of the entrance to the harbor. This extension will connect the breakwater with the shore on the north beach and besides offsetting the drift-

The building of another breakwater south of the entrance to the harbor will provide what is known as an arrowhead entrance to the local waterway and will greatly add to the protection of shipping as well as preserve the piers of the harbor.

Free Movement of Boats The proposed plan of extending the west end of the south pier to a point farther south will not only provide more area for the mooring of small craft but will likewise afford larger boats more freedom of movement in the harbor.
