**Leadership Training
School for Township
Church School Workers**

The churches of Lake Bluff, Lake Forest, Deerfield, Northbrook, Glen-
coe, and Highland Park are co-operat-
ing in a plan for a Community Lead-
ership Training school under the aus-
pices of the Deerfield-Shields Town-
ship Sunday School association, to be
held sometime during February or
March. Each year the churches raise
the standards of instruction; in some
localities each teacher within the
Sunday school is required to compete
certain units of training in religious
education each year, other churches
require that their teachers complete
Standard Leadership Training courses
in Religious Education before taking
up any work in the Sunday school.
A Community leadership training
school will be a co-operative venture
which will not only help to raise our
standards on the northshore but help
to increase the inter-church fellow-
ship.

On Friday evening at 7:30 there
will be a meeting held in the Beth-
any Evangelical church, corner of
Laurel and McGovern streets, for the
purpose of making further arrange-
ments for the school.

Mr. Emerson O. Brandshaw, direc-
tor of leadership training schools for
the Church Federation of Chicago,
will be present to help us work out
our plans. Each church in the town-
ship is asked to send one representa-
tive who will be the key person of
that church. Pastors and Sunday
school superintendents are also in-
vited to be present. Some churches
have already taken definite action and
appointed representatives. If your
church has not already done so, it
is not yet too late. For further in-
