Frank St. Leger conducts.

The performance concludes with Act IV of "Il Trovatore" with Claudia Muzio as Leonora, Cyrena Van Gordon as Azucena, Antonio Cortis as Manrico and Giovanni Inghilleri as County of Luna. Roberto Moranzoni will conduct.
