

### BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

#### Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore; County Seat

Building in Libertyville during the year 1929 showed a continued growth of the village with a total of \$383,300 in permits taken out at the office of village clerk O. J. Boehm, up to Monday, December 30th.

Confirmation of the first public improvement, for resurfacing a street in Bannockburn, was completed Saturday before County Judge P. L. Persons. This is the first special assessment case for the newly organized village.

On Monday of last week Frank J. Druba completed his first year as chief of police in Libertyville, succeeding the late Dennis Limberry who died suddenly on December 28, 1928.

Mrs. William Morley, wife of William L. Morley, assistant cashier of the Antioch State bank and well known in that part of the county was found dead in her bed by her husband, when he went to her room to call her last week.

Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence A. Dobb little last week celebrated their silver wedding anniversary with a few relatives at their home in the county building. The sheriff and his wife

have spent their entire lives in Lake county and most of that time in Waukegan.

Albert W. Finel, a resident of Lake county for nearly forty years, passed away at his home on Green Bay road one half mile north of the York house church recently, after an extended illness. He was 48 years of age.

Beginning Jan. 1, 1930, of the new year, Libertyville residents will pay the increased water rates set by the city council several weeks ago. The increase was found necessary in order to meet the mounting operating costs of the water system.

Two Milwaukee aviation enthusiasts, who were on their way to participate in the Guggenheim Safety competition at New York city, made a forced landing on Belvidere road near Wilson last week with small damage done to the specially built ship they were flying.

#### Will Ask Padlock For Roadhouse at Half-Day

The roadhouse operated by Tom Williams at Half Day will be padlocked some time in January in pursuance of an injunction filed by State's Attorney A. V. Smith, says Foote, the owner of the building which houses the beer parlor, was also named in the injunction.

The action is the outcome of a raid conducted by Constable George Stried on December 21.

#### Five Lake Co. Persons Killed in Aviation Accidents in 1929

Five Lake county people met death in air mishaps this year. The first accident that ended fatally happened near the Waukegan airport on May 11 when Elmer Hobbs, 20, Zion, and Clarence E. Bradshaw, 36, Zion, were killed.

The next crash to cost a life was on June 15, when Harry Gartley, 27, of Waukegan, crashed to his death.

Two Lake county people came to an untimely end on Sept. 14 at

Northbrook when an airplane in which they and two others were riding crashed to earth. The local people who were killed were Mrs. Mildred Bird, 27, Highland Park, and William Johnson, 23, Deerfield.
