In the fascinatingly interesting series of letters written in Chicago in the years preceeding the Civil war by Martha F. Esmond to her friend Julia Boyd of New York. Now appearing in the society section of the Chicago Tribune, mention was made last Sunday of L. B. Page who was the father of the late Mrs. Boomer Page, well known kindergarten teacher of the Chicago Teacher's college and was superintendent of the De Forest school in Highland Park at the time of her death. Mr. Boomer was mentioned in the letter as representing Chicago at the funeral of the brave Colonel Ellsworth who took down the secession flag in the Marshal House in Alexandria, Va., and was shot by the proprietor at the beginning of the Civil war.
