Lake County Man Has Resigned from State Penitentiary Staff

A shakeup in the official personnel of the Illinois state penitentiary in Joliet under the direction of Warden Henry C. Hill was seen last week with the transfer of two high officials and the resignation of several guards.

Deputy Warden William Barrowman, second in command at the old penintentiary, has been transferred to the official staff of the reformatory at Pontiac, while James R. Carpenter, second assistant superintendent at Pontiac, has been transferred to the prison at Joliet as a captain of guards.

S. G. Scott, who was captain of guards at the new prison and was recently transferred to the old penitentiary, has been transferred to Menard.

Guards Are Transferred James O. Duncan and Edward Newton Payton, guards, were transferred from Joliet to Pontiac, while Guards Richard Turner and Chas. O. McMahon were transferred from Pontiac to Joliet. The resignation of George M. Hicks of Lockport, Fred A. Burke of Lake county and Owen T. Burdnick, all guards, have been accepted by Warden Hill.

All changes were made, Warden Hill said, "for the good of the service" and with the approval of Rodney Brandon, state director of the department of public welfare, and Col. F. W. Whipp, state superintendent of prisons.
