## Dying Wish of Veteran Carried Out by Legion

Logansport, Ind. - Twentyfive members of Cass county Post No. 60, the American Legion, of Logansport, Ind., carried out the dying wish of Legionnaire Clarence Jester, when they stood beside his grave with bared heads.

Jester fell victim of disability incurred in service and his last wish was that Cass county Legionnaires would see that he was buried in Soldier's Circle, a Logansport project which he helped to obtain. Although Jester died in Cincinnati, O., the Logansport Legionnaires provided a guard of honor, saw that the body was returned, and gave him the burial he desired.
