denied that he had shot Steuber, claiming that he fired his pistol into the air to frighten the plumber and Walter Ludlow of Highland Park, who he said were attacking him. A few minutes after the shooting, however, officials say he told his wife he had killed a man.

Steuber, who lives at 714 Massena avenue, Waukegan, was in the restaurant with Ludlow when Klarkowski entered. The deputy sheriff who lives at 1531 Monroe street, Waukegan, had returned from a visit to Racine, where he was formerly a policeman. Klarkowski, it is said, made a slighting remark which provoked a quarrel. Steuber and Ludlow followed him into the street, but, according to Ludlow, they were returning to the restaurant when Klarkowski whipped out his revolver and began firing.

Inquest on Saturday
Chief of Police Thomas E. Kennedy took Klarkowski to the Lake county jail. The inquest was continued until next Saturday.

During the last two months Klarkowski has been suspended twice for periods of 10 days each on charges of drunkenness.
