**BIG POWER PLANT IN
WAUKEGAN IS IN POOL**

**Connected With Widespread
Electric System; To Be
Greatly Enlarged Later**

With the completion of the work of making connections with electric systems in several cities in northwestern Illinois, the great network of power systems of which the one in Waukegan is an important part, was considerably enlarged, says the Waukegan Sun.

The connecting of the vast group of power systems is being made with the object of assuring uninterrupted power to all of the communities within its network in the event of emergency situations.

Add Large Plant

The new acquisitions to the system now links the monster plant of the Public Service company at this city with other large plants such as is located at Powerton, Rockford and other large power producing centers in the western part of the state.

The Waukegan plant is now connected with a vast eastern system that obtains its power from as far east as the gigantic Windsor plant located at Wheeling, W. V., and in time under present plans it will be lined with monster plants in the New York district. The system will also in time extend westward until it is linked with the monster Mississippi river power dam at Keokuk. It now extends north from Waukegan into Wisconsin, being connected with the big T. M. E. R. & L. company system which radiates out of Milwaukee.

To Be World's Largest

The great power pool, will in time become one of the largest, if not the largest, in the world and Waukegan will have an important place in the great system. Through the formation of the great system no section of the vast area covered will be without power no matter how serious may be the destroying actions of the elements in any portion of it.

**American Flag for
