Feb. 3, Hendee States Candidates for county offices will not be able to file their petitions with County Clerk Lew A. Hendee prior to February 3 he ruled last week.

Attorney General Oscar Carlstrom had held that it would be legal to accept petitions February 1.

County Clerk Robert Sweitzer, of Cook county, got an opinion from Meyer, Mayer, Austrain & Platt, however, that caused him to set the date for filing in Cook county for February 3.
