

### A. & P. Stores Report Coffee Prices Down

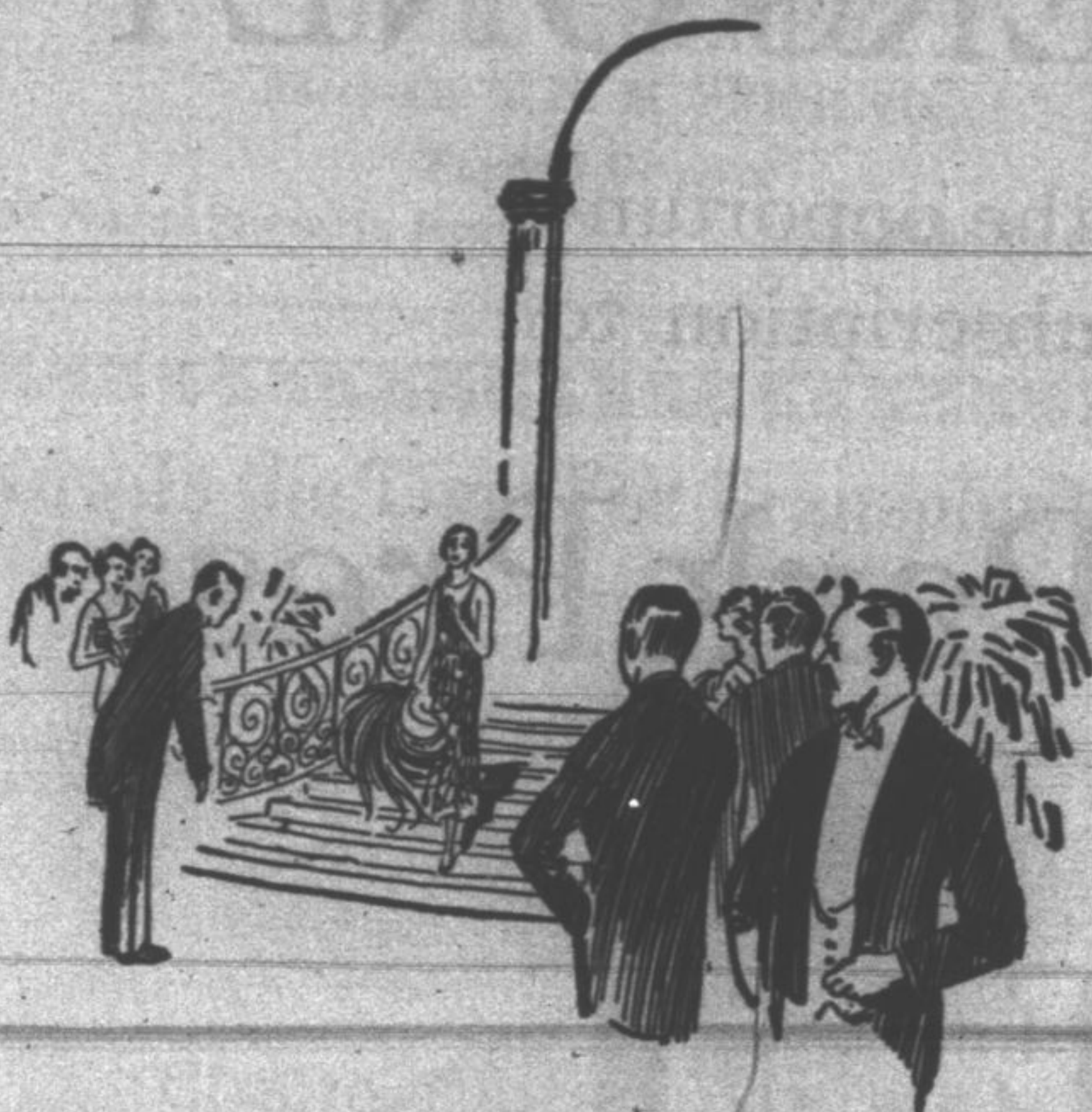
Coffee bids fair to elbow all other commodities out of the limelight in so far as repeated price reductions are concerned. And with each price reduction the smile of the housewife broadens. For coffee is one of the food items to be reckoned with when the manager of home affairs makes up her weekly food budget.

The latest cut in coffee is put into effect by the A&P food stores and the prices announced show a radical reduction from previous prices. These new low prices apply to three nationally known brands—Eight O'Clock brand, Red Circle brand and Bokar. These three coffees are now

selling in A&P stores at prices 25 per cent less than the regular prices of two or three months ago.

Announcements by the A&P food stores point out that the continued decline in the prices of coffee at wholesale provided the opportunity for the present sharp retail price reductions now effective.

The fact that the Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea company, a nation-wide system of chain food stores, 15,000 in number, has promptly followed the decline in the wholesale prices of coffee with equivalent retail reductions would seem to refute the idea held by many observers that large organizations move slowly when it comes to passing on to the public savings made possible by lower commodity prices.

#### Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore; County Seat

Despondent because he had suffered for weeks from poor health, Joseph Varsek, 32, of Waukegan last week hanged himself in the garage in the rear of his home.

Carl Sprague, a well known and old resident of Vernon township, died at his home in Prairie View last week after a week's illness from pneumonia. He was born in Prairie View 73 years ago. He is survived by his wife, three sons and a daughter.

Property to the value of \$86,000 was threatened, damaged or destroyed by fire during 1929, a report announced by the Antioch Fire department shows. Losses to the amount of \$65,975 are reported and the insurance coverage was \$67,000.

Desire Reuse of Burdick street, Libertyville, an aged and highly respected resident of the village, passed away last week at the Elizabeth Con-dell hospital. Mr. Reuse died from pneumonia following an operation.

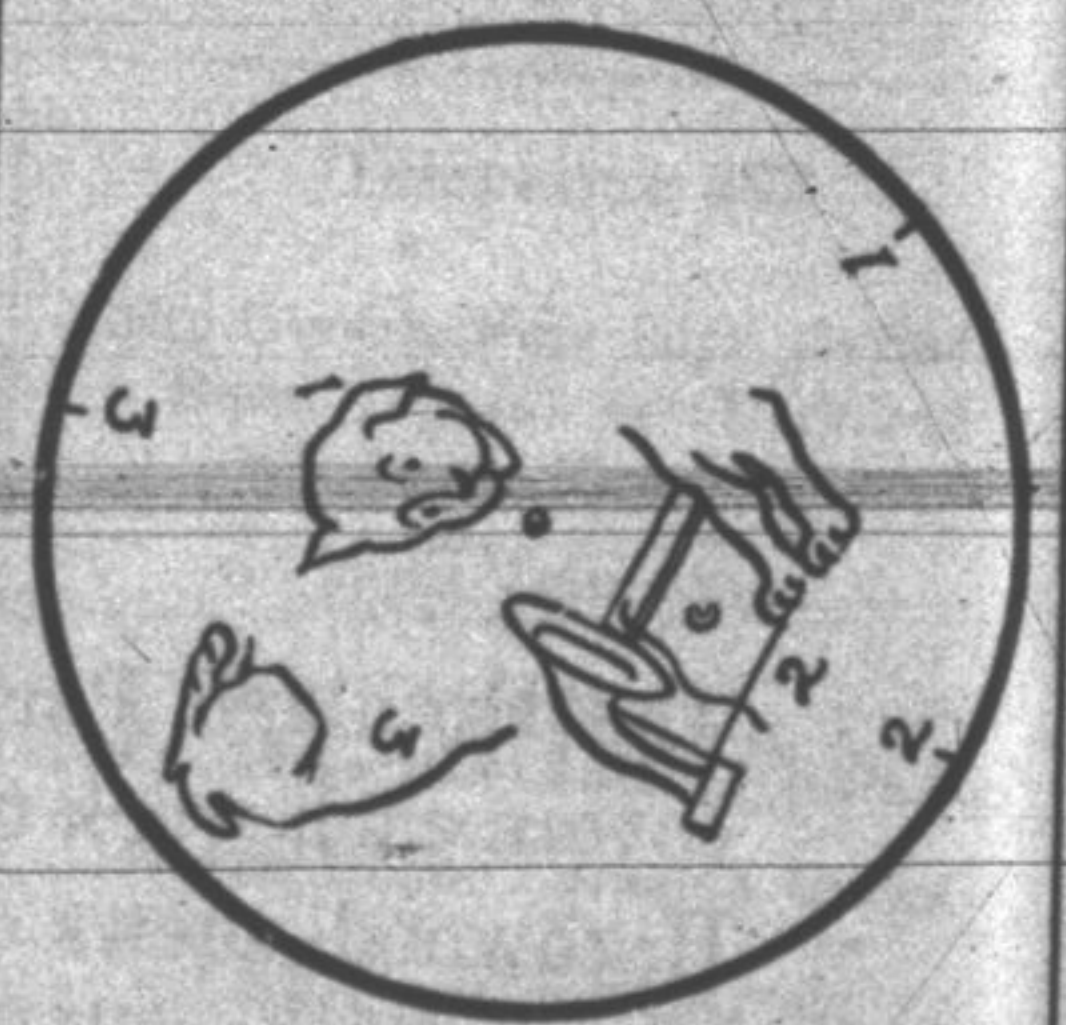
