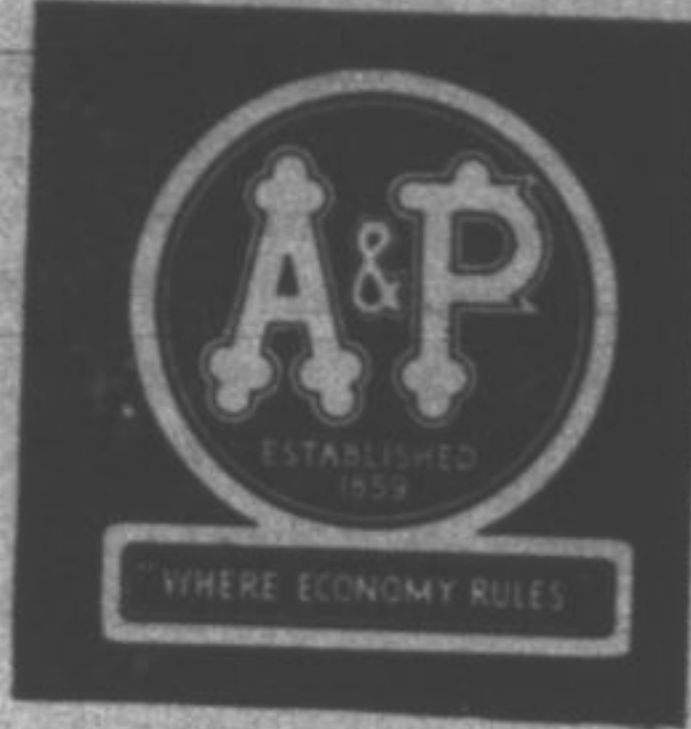

PLANS FOR CENSUS IN THIS DISTRICT

Enumerators to Start April 1; Mrs. Northam of Evanston Is Supervisor

Definite plans to take the 1930 Federal census of Lake county have been outlined by Mrs. Estelle Northam of Evanston, who was appointed supervisor for the district by Senator Charles S. Deneen.

The high points in her plan, as evolved by the supervisors and advisors from Washington, indicate that 69 men and women, one for each precinct, will be employed in the county. In addition rigid examinations will pay from \$5 to \$2 daily, be taken starting as early as Feb. 1 for the army of census takers that will be put in the field April 1.

April 1 Zero Hour

"The enumerators will take the field April 1 all over the country. They should finish in Lake county within two to three weeks. The positions will pay from \$5 to \$2 daily, Mrs. Northam declared in discussion the task that comes but once in a decade.

Mrs. Northam believes that the census in most precincts will run close to 1,800.

"A good enumerator should cover a field of 1,800 persons in two to three weeks time," she declared.

Of the 69 precincts contained in Lake county the bulk are along the north shore. There are 24 in Waukegan township, for instance, six in Benton township where Zion and Winthrop Harbor are located, eight in Deerfield, and six in Shields.

Examinations Planned

There will be efforts made to learn those qualifications to serve enumerators as the first step, according to Mrs. Northam. Then questionnaires will be sent for these prospective employes to answer. If the answers qualify the persons they will be invited to the Evanston headquarters to submit to oral examinations.

"The work is very important and for this reason the government will have to draw on the best qualified persons in each community to take the census," she stated.

Most of these preliminary steps will be taken February 1. This will allow time to fill the ranks of enumerators so that they can take the field April 1.

Mrs. Northam pointed out that it would be necessary for the census takers to know definitely that they can give the full time to cover their precincts before considering another position.

To Work Against Frauds

She has taken every precaution to avoid petty criminals from taking advantage of the census.

"All of the census takers will bear government credentials so that the residents will know for a certainty that they are actual servants of the United States government. It is my plan to get a resident of the precinct to take the census so that they will be known to the most people," she declared.
