flicting dates several churches were not represented at the opening meeting. Courses and Instructors
The courses offered and the instructors are:

"The Study of the Pupil" is taught by Dr. H. C. Coffman of the School of Religious Education of Northwestern University. Dr. Coffman is a specialist in child problems and comes with a wide experience in Y. M. C. A. work as well as in religious education. "Primary Materials and Methods" is taught by Miss Bertha Wheelock. Miss Wheelock has done special work under the Congregational Church, in the Chicago Council of Religious Education, in the Chicago Graded Union, and is superintendent of the primary department in the Wilmette Congregational Church. "Junior Materials and Methods" is taught by Dr. Marian O. Hawthorne of the School of Religious Education of Northwestern University. Miss Hawthorne has written a number of texts for use in the Vacation Church School and in the Sunday Church School. Miss Marian L. Norris, who is circulation manager for the International Journal of Religious Education, and actively engaged in teaching in Leadership Training Schools all over the Middle West, and is one who is deeply concerned with the problems of youth, comes well fitted to teach "Intermediate-Senior Materials and Methods." All classes are taught simultaneously and so only one course may be taken, but each one meets the needs of the teachers in the particular age grouping.
