Reading Merit Badge It has been asked that the Reading Merit badge requirements be printed on this page again in as much as the new pamphlet is not yet out and some fellows did not keep the copy of the last print.

To obtain a Merit badge for read-

ing, a scout must:

1. Read at least one book a month for a year after becoming a second class scout including among the 12 books read, three standard works and three on some phase of scouting. Present a list of books read.

2. Present a book review or tell which books he liked best and why. 3. Describe the character he liked

best in his fictional reading. 4. If a library is available, have a membership card, which must be

presented. 5. List several books he plans to read in the next 12 months.

6. Tell where he gets his books, and present a list of books which he owns.

7. Name the books which his reading, or speaking about, has encouraged other scouts to read. Give the names of boys or boy.

8. Be a subscriber and a reader of a boy's magazine for at least the preceding six months.

9. Tell what other magazines he reads and why.

10. Present a short essay on the value of reading.
