Asks Information of Gold Star Mothers in District on Pilgrimage

Postmaster Mancel Talcott of Waukegan has issued a call for all Gold Mothers in this district to apply to him for information concerning the pilgrimage to Europe which is being paid for by the United States government.

All mothers and widows of deceased soldiers, sailors and marines of the American forces interred in the cemeteries of Europe are invited to make the pilgrimage as the guests of the government. The visitors will be given a two week's stay in Europe and the dates for the trip are from May 1 to Oct. 31, 1930. All expenses of the mothers and return, are paid by the government.

Talcott has completed information on this pilgrimage and will be glad to furnish all data if advised of the

names and addresses of those interested in making the trip.

Mr. Talcott, who is graves registrations officer of the American Legion for Lake county has a complete list of all deceased veterans from Illinois buried in cemeteries in Europe. The list was prepared by the Quartermaster General of the Army at the request of Congressman Carl R. Chindblom. Another list of next of kin is now being prepared.

Congressman Chindblom will personally attend to all applications from his district.
