Girl Reserves
February 3, being the first Monday in the month was the dinner-meeting for the Girl Reserve committee. At this time twelve of the committee enjoyed the twenty-five cents chilli dinner served by the high school Swastika Girl Reserves which they prepared and for which they sold tickets to help make money to pay their pledges to the Y. W. C. A. The mother of Wilma Knoblock, one of the Swastika girls, helped the club to make the chilli. The girls cleared between five and six dollars.

Mrs. Wilson Kline, chairman of the Girl Reserve committee, suggested the possibility of having this dinner meeting continue as a purely advisers meeting since there are now twelve advisers and the five o'clock time seems to suit their programs better than any other.
