SUBURBAN BUILDING SHOWING DECREASE

Loss for January as Compared With Same Month in 1929; Also December

Building construction, according to permits issued in the 38 principal suburbs, totaled \$1,128,230 in January. The construction volume in the metropolitan area, based on the Chicago figures for January and the suburbs reporting, amounted to \$6,612,730, according to the building survey department of S. W. Straus & Co.

The figures for the suburbs reporting show a loss as against January last year, as well as against December, 1929.

Niles Center made the most spectacular gain of all the suburbs, registering last month a gain of 1200 per cent. Other suburbs making a gain in January over the same month a year ago were as follows: Blue Island 544 per cent, Elgin 77 per cent, Geneva 5 per cent, Lake Forest 124 per cent.
