Scout Leaders Training Course The "Elements of Scoutmastership" will be the name given to the training course in Boy Scout leadership offered by the North Shore Area council starting February 24, 25 and 26. In order to lower the traveling distance to these courses, the plans are to hold the course in three different centers of the area. One group will meet in Winnetka on Mondays starting the 24th. The second group will meet in Highland Park on Tuesday nights, starting February 25, and the third group will meet in Libertyville on Wednesday nights, starting Februnry 26. These groups will all run the same program, in fact for the three hike meetings to be held on Saturdays all three groups will meet together.


