Deerfield-Shields Students Hear Some of the Numbers; Westinghouse "Mechanical Man" to Be Seen in the Schools

The School Assembly Association organized in recent years to supplement high school work and enrich school life with monthly programs of vivid interest, held its annual tryout of speakers and entertainers at Highland Park on Thursday, February 6, and in Joliet and Chicago the two succeeding days. Of the forty-one candidates recommended by various members of the association twentyseven were tried out before the advisory board of principals. Of these, fourteen appeared in the local high school auditorium before study hall groups of students.
