**To Broadcast Hoover's Talk**  
President Herbert Hoover, who is the Honorary President of the Scouts of America, will be the chief speaker at a dinner meeting in celebration of the twentieth anniversary of Scouting in America, which will be held at the Willard hotel, Washington, D. C., on March 10. His talk will be broadcast over two national radio networks, that of the National Broadcasting company and the Columbia Broadcasting system. The United States Marine Band will play.

Walter W. Head, president of the Foreman-State National Bank of Chicago and former president of the American Bankers association, as president of the Boy Scouts of America, will be among the speakers.

Since February 8, 1910, 4,879,273 different individuals have been definitely enrolled as members of the Boy Scouts of America and at the present time there are 842,250 active scouts and scout officials.

### Hold Court of Honor

On February 11, 1930 Troop 61 of Northbrook had a court of honor in connection with the dedication of the new school gym. The program started with a speech by Mr. Watson explaining to the people the scout movement and its influence in Northbrook. A third year charter was presented to the troop and also the new troop flag was displayed for the first time. Awards were given out. Second class awards were made to Billy Schick and Lewis Cooksy, Richard Thormeyer received a merit badge in leathercraft. All scouts got their new registration cards for 1930. The court of honor was closed with the scout oath. The program of the dedication continued. A large crowd attended this meeting.

### State Checking Up on All Places Selling by Pound or Yard; Details

The state is just starting its annual check-up on all places in Illinois, outside the larger cities, that sell anything by poundage, by quartage or by yardage.

Twelve inspectors of weights and measures, are beginning their annual visitation, Director Leo H. Lowe of the department of trade and commerce announced today.

Traveling in trucks, each inspector carries 30 50-pound weights, each with a handle, and numerous smaller weights ranging down to the tiniest, also liquid measures of various capacities. They will visit chiefly grocery stores, gasoline stations, drug stores, elevators and coal scales but their inspection work covers everything sold according to weight of measurements.

With the reorganization of the division just completed by W. T. Fossett, state superintendent of standards, an inspector of weights and measures has been appointed in each of the 12 districts in the state.
