Uses Chemical to Free Ship from Ice Hamper

Science was credited with another victory over nature today after a chemical compound had liberated a steamship from an ice-locked drydock in three minutes.

Dr. Howard T. Barnes of McGill university, using a high-pressure pump and hose, sprayed the thick ice about the Champlain dry dock at Lauzon, where the Italian freighter Concordia was frozen in.

Under the action of the chemical the ice splintered with a thunderous noise and the ship floated free. The ice was broken into small particles. Experiments have been made with the compound to break up river ice and to remove snow from streets.

FATAL DROWNINGS IN COUNTY IN YEAR

Seventeen Persons Victims of Accidents in Lakes; Fewer Than 1928

Although the number of drownings in Lake county during the past 12 months did not reach the mark set in 1928, it did, nevertheless, exceed the total in 1927.

Seventeen persons lost their lives in Lake county waters in 1929, a review of the past year shows. Besides these 17, one Lake county man, Gus Johnson, formerly of Lake Forest, was found dead in the Chicago river.

In 1927 there were 12 drownings in Lake county. In 1928 this figure took an astonishing jump to 21 downings. For a time it was hoped that the record for this year would be lower than the one for 1927, but a tragedy at Long Lake that took five lives in a twinkling sent the death total for this year beyond the former low mark.
