Reichardt Explains Increased Insurance in Property Damage

Satisfactory experience under excess limits for Automobile Property Damage Insurance and a desire to give all policyholders the benefit of more adequate protection has caused the leading casualty insurance companies of the country to announce that car owners will now receive without additional cost a minimum of \$5,000 protection under their Property Damage policies rather than the \$1,000 minimum limit which has previously been in force.

Damage policies which are now in force will be changed by endorsement or by interpretation so that present policyholders will benefit by the increased protection. The additional coverage will apply to accidents occurring on or after the effective date of the change.

According to W. W. Reichardt, 388 Central avenue, local representative of the Hartford Accident and Indemnity company, this means that a car owner who becomes involved in an accident which results in the destruction of the property of others is protected up to \$5,000. His insurance company agrees to pay up to that amount for any loss for which the assured may be legally liable—to pay all costs taxed against the policyholder in any suit—and to defend in the name of the policyholder any suit which may result under a Property Damage claim.

The value of this increased protection is apparent when you consider the extent of property damage frequently caused by automobile accidents. Mr. Reichardt referred to a number of such cases including the recent collapse of a steel bridge structure over the Blanchard river in Hancock county, Ohio, and several cases where entire stone fronts

have been shattered by the catapulting force of automobiles. Although the Property Damage limit has been increased voluntarily by the companies and at no expense to the car owner, it remains for him to look to his own protection in the matter of automobile insurance which covers legal liability for bodily injuries to others.
