

James Bradley, Pioneer, Dies at Libertyville; Born in County, 1859

James A. Bradley of Libertyville, who would have celebrated his 71st birthday February 22, died February 18. Mr. Bradley was born at Roundout on Feb. 22, 1859, and lived his entire life in that vicinity. Bradley road was named after his father, an early pioneer.

On November 27, 1882, Mr. Bradley married Ellen Ludlow. He was a farmer all of his life, and at his retirement five years ago moved to Libertyville. For the past four years, the deceased has been in poor health, the last year being necessitated to spend most of the time in hospitals.

Mrs. Bradley preceded her husband in death on January 14, 1930.

Mr. Bradley is survived by the following children, Mesdames Mary Mors, Catherine Andrews, Adeline Pester, and Isabelle Schnabbele, all of Libertyville, and one son, Edward Bradley of Lake Forest, three sisters, Mrs. Danile Redmond, Omaha, Neb. Mrs. Michael Redmond and Miss Grace Bradley, both of Lake Forest, and two brothers, Joseph of Chicago and Harry of Libertyville.

Funeral services were held Friday at 10 a. m., from the St. Joseph church of Libertyville. Interment was in the St. Patrick's cemetery at Everett.

Arrest Three Charged With Shooting Young Man at Wadsworth

Three Wadsworth youths were arrested late last week, charged with robbery with a gun and assault with a deadly weapon, following an investigation of more than a week by Deputy Sheriff Emmett Hastings. The boys held are Walter and Lester Bloom, both in their early twenties, and Roy Schlosser, 18.

Hastings has been working secretly ever since he was informed that in the early morning of February 8, Gerald Cashmore, 17, of Wadsworth, was forced into a ditch on Telegraph road as he was driving home from Wadsworth and robbed of \$1.50 by two armed young men who shot him in the right upper arm before they were driven away by a third youth, Shooting Kept Secret.

Young Cashmore was confined to his home for more than a week thereafter and the cause of his confinement was kept a secret by his family. When the two Bloom boys, therefore, were overheard telling people that Cashmore had been shot, suspicion immediately pointed to them. Their physique, moreover, answered the description given to Hastings by the victim, and they were arrested along with their buddy, Schlosser, who answered the description of the third party to the crime. They stoutly denied guilt.

Huge New Building at Steel Wire Co. Finished

Erection of the new large wire drawing mill, a unit of the plant of the American Steel and Wire company in Waukegan, started last fall has been completed.

The structure which cost more than \$700,000 and which is one of the largest of the series of buildings which go to make up Waukegan's largest industry is now being equipped with machinery.

Indications are that the new addition will be ready for operation within a month and it is expected that it will be placed in service as soon as possible. Completion of the work of equipping the structure will be followed by a large increase in the force of workers in the wire drawing department of this big plant.

The building is 200 feet long. It is of brick and steel construction and strictly modern.
