

Ravinia Woman's Club to Hear Karl Borders

An intellectual treat on a very timely topic will be provided for the Ravinia Woman's club at its regular meeting in the Ravinia Auditorium next Wednesday at 2:15 p. m. when Karl Borders of the Chicago Commons social settlement speaks on the Russian Peasant.

Mr. Borders is Kentucky born and was trained for the ministry but has spent his mature years chiefly in the educational and settlement field. He has taught mission schools in the

Philippines and has been to Russia four times, spending three years in that country altogether.

The greater part of his Russian years were spent among the peasantry instead of in the big cities, thus reversing the usual practice of foreigners in that land. He is the author of Village Life Under the Soviets. He will portray the life of the Russian peasant as he observed it in its old forms and as it began to change under the huge agricultural reform that has been inaugurated by the Soviet government.

Mr. Borders is now assistant head resident of Chicago Commons.
