

Attack Fake Tourists Who Profit by Sale of Goods Bought in Canada

American bargain hunters of the one-day tourist variety who cross the Canadian and Mexican borders just long enough to buy merchandise at prices below the United States standards, and then rush back home to resell them in this country at higher rates, taking advantage of the custom exemption, permitting travelers freedom of duty on purchases made abroad and totalling less than \$100 a person, may be deprived of the much abused privilege, if representations made by the Chicago Association of Commerce prevail in the United States Senate.

The big midwestern business group urges an amendment to the pending Tariff Bill limiting the free duty to tourists who have been abroad at least seven days.

Charles Ward Seabury, president of the Association of Commerce, discussing the protest, said, "We are not opposed to the ordinary traveler who makes casual purchases while abroad, but we do feel that something should be done to curb the unethical practices of merchants who use the tourist free duty rule to buy across the border and then to resell in the United States in competition with the greater number of ethical business concerns who operate legitimately, paying the regular import duties on foreign made wares.

"A change limiting the free duty privilege to persons abroad for at least seven days, would not interfere to any material extent with purchases

made legitimately by American tourists, but would only have the effect of making more operative the intent of the present law which is so easily circumvented."

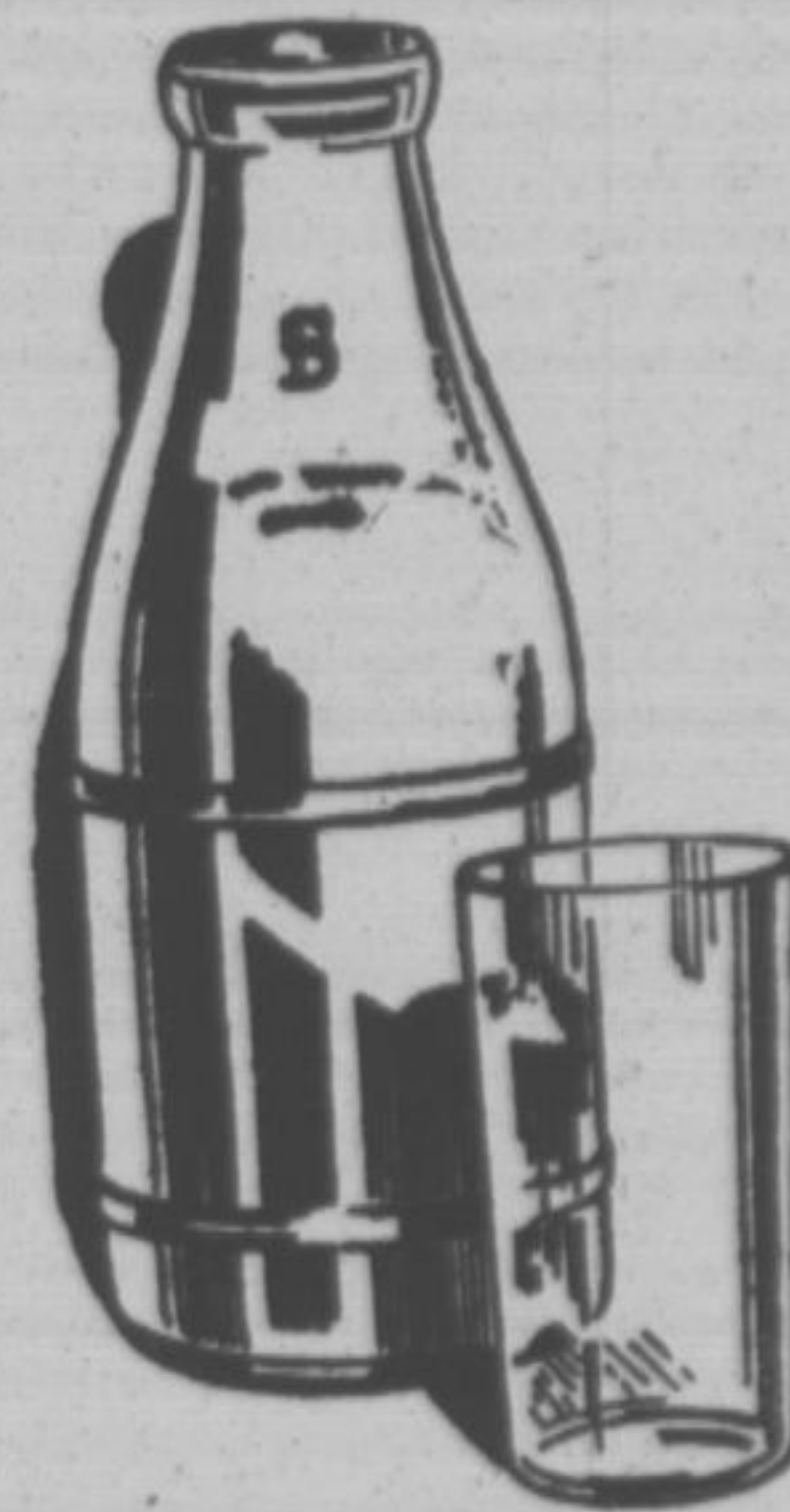
