made in the 6th and 7th holes and that the new 8th green would be ready for use in time for the North Shore Open.

Many matters of importance came before the park board and was acted on. The one of importance to the Ravinia district is the final agreement of the board to the settlement made by Mr. Hicks, attorney for the board, to the objections which have been pending in court for more than a year.

The board acted favorably on the recommendation of Superintendent Edw. M. Laing for the addition of a locker room and pro's shop and for the erection of a fence along part of Deerfield avenue at the golf course.

Mr. John Udell was elected vice-president of the board. This office was provided for by the State Legislature at its last session. Mr. Udell, a prominent business man of Highland Park, is constantly in touch with its needs.

Mr. Laing was directed to assist the city in beautifying the grounds at the new City hall and to landscape the adjoining park property.

The directors of the Sunset Valley Golf club held their meeting in the adjoining room. Vice-president El-

mer Skidmore presided, while Mr. Laing, the president, was performing his duties as secretary for the Park board. The main deliberation of the directors was the preparing for the North Shore Open, providing a handicap system for the club, and the appointment of a committee of ladies to promote tournaments among their membership.

The North Shore Open will be held on June 23 and will be bigger and better than last year.

A meeting of the various committees will be held at the Park Board office on Tuesday, March 18, to complete the plans for the activities of the club.
