

Chicago Daily Times to Print Valentino's Story by Former Wife

Chicago's illustrated tabloid newspaper, the Daily Times, shows its enterprise by publishing a story for which movie fans have been waiting a long time. It is the life story of Rudolph Valentino, the greatest movie star in the history of the films. The Daily Times has secured the exclusive rights to the story, which was written by Natacha Rambova, Valentino's wife, who calls this interesting biography "The Truth About Rudolph Valentino."

Miss Rambova met Valentino when he was drifting around the movie lots of Hollywood looking for a job. She relates how he got his first chance before the camera, how he rose to fame through the "Four Horsemen" and "The Sheik," his troubles with producers, his response to the tide of adulation and mash notes sent to him by tens of thousands of women and girls and the ambition that he had to do great things with his talents.

There have been many stories printed about Valentino. Most of these have been from the pens of authors who scarcely knew the great Italian-born artist. Valentino's career split Hollywood in two. One side placed many criticisms on the head of Miss Rambova, who was blamed for "wearing the pants" in the Valentino family and making trouble between Rudy and his producers. For the first time Miss Rambova gives a new version of the tribulations of

a great star which should be of unusual interest to every person who enjoys the movies.

"The Truth About Rudolph Valentino" will run daily in The Times beginning Wednesday, March 12. It is illustrated with pictures from the personal album of Miss Rambova.

North Chicago Plans to Have City Court

Members of the North Chicago Council last week unanimously voted to call a special election on the proposition of establishing a city court in North Chicago.

The date was set for March 22 and polls in all three wards will be open from 7 o'clock in the morning until 5 o'clock in the afternoon.

A city judge in North Chicago would receive an annual salary of \$2,000. This is based on the population of the city. The state pays the judge's salary.

The other costs would be defrayed by the city and the county. The city would have to supply a court room while the sheriff would have to appoint a North Chicago deputy and the state's attorney would have to name a prosecutor.

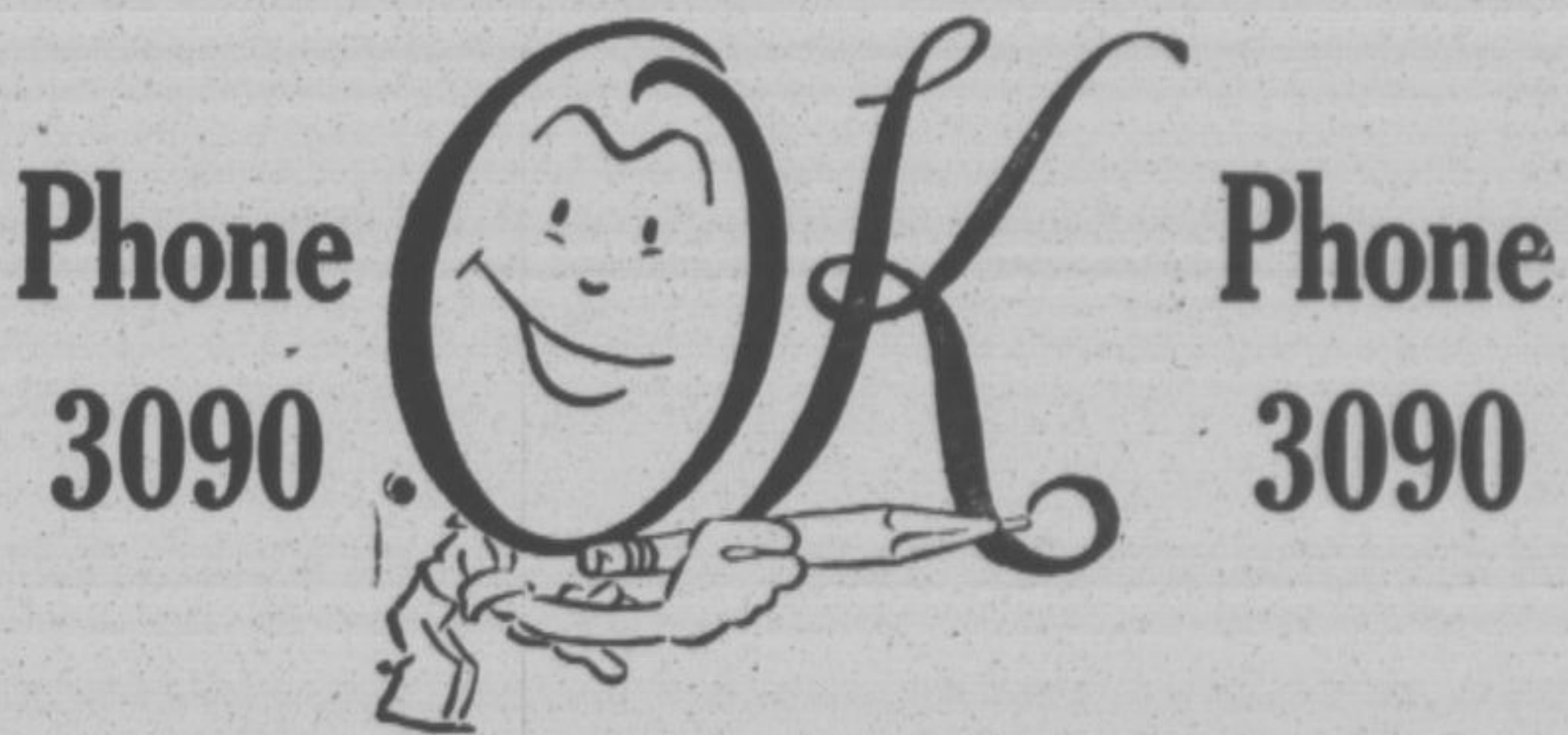
