At later meetings, the teachers of special subjects, Miss Adelaide Hudson, of the music department, Mrs. Elizabeth B. Evelyn Pearsons, principal of the Ravinia school, gave most interesting and instructive talks on their work with the children, with illustrations of the work done by the pupils.

In order to complete the understanding between the parents and teachers, the coming program will be given by the parents themselves. Three interesting phases will be presented, and it is hoped that questions and discussion will follow the very short presentation of these matters of vital interest.

Mrs. Ove Jensen, who has done some exceptionally fine work at her summer home on an inland lake in Northern Michigan, in keeping her children mentally and physically occupied in ways that supplement the school training, will give a short talk on how she accomplishes this, and how others could do likewise.

Mr. Robert L. Want \$25,000 for T. B. Addition to Hospital

The joint committee of supervisors from the hospital committee and Lake County Tuberculosis association will ask the county board for \$25,000 for an addition to the overcrowded tuberculosis ward at the Lake County General hospital at the session this week.

Supervisor David Van Patten, of Newport township, chairman of the hospital committee, is in accord with

the request and will speak in favor of the appropriation, he admitted today.

"It is a step that the county should take. The only argument that can be presented against it is the cramped financial condition of the county but this should not stand in the way," he remarked.

It has been impossible through lack of space and facilities to care for paupers afflicted with tuberculosis at the hospital for several years. As many patients as possible are crowded into the building and the rest are forced to remain at home or at work.

Cooked Salad Dressing

1 teaspoon salt
1½ tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon dry mustard
½ teaspoon paprika
1 egg
Few grains cayenne
2 tablespoon flour
2 tablespoons butter
¾ cup milk
¼ cup lemon juice
Mix dry ingredients, add egg and mix thoroughly, add milk gradually and then butter. Cook in double boiler until thick. Add lemon juice.
