Covers 37 Miles

The program, as approved by the board and state department, covers 37 miles of paving in all sections of the county, including the completion of the long planned road enterting the south end of the county at Buf road and extending north through Mundelein, Druce lake and to Wedges corners to connect with Millburn road and then north to the Wisconsin line at Pikesville.

The bond issue, according to R. M. Lobdell, would complete the secondary system of highways connecting village and larger communities of the county with the principal system.
