Mrs. Grace Hainline of Fort Sheridan passed away suddenly in the Fort Sheridan hospital at 12:30 Tuesday, March 18. Mrs. Hainline's health had not been good for some time but her condition was not thought of as being serious until complications set in. She was a woman of sterling character. The entire community will mourn her loss for to know her was to love her. She was president of the Fort Sheridan bridge club and chairman of the Literary department of the Woman's club. She was a fine speaker and only a short time ago gave a splendid talk on her own "Life in Alaska" for the benefit of the Woman's club of Fort Sheridan which was most interesting. She was to address the Woman's club at Dixon, Ill., Tuesday, March 18, the day of her passing—on the same subject. Her remains were sent to Macomb, Iowa, for burial, which took place Wednesday at three o'clock. She leaves to survive her a husband, Staff Sergeant R. L. Hainline, two sisters and a brother of Macomb, Iowa.

"Drug Store" Racket Gets Chicago Man in Jail Here; Other Cases

William Deming, giving his address as the Lorraine hotel in Chicago was held in the Highland Park city jail this week, accused of being the perpetrator of the "drug store racket" on the Earl W. Gsell drug store last week-end, he was returned to Highland Park from Lake Forest Saturday morning after his arrest by Lake Forest police.

Leonard Nelson of the Curlee drug store, Waukegan, and a messenger from the Lunda drug store in Waukegan, partially identified Deming as the man who worked the game there, but after picking him out of a crowd of a dozen men in the Lake Forest police station they later said that they were not positive.

The same racket that was worked so successfully in Waukegan had been worked in other places along the north shore including Glencoe, Winnetka, Highland Park and Kenosha, but Deming was arrested in Lake Forest when the police followed the drug store messenger on a call.

In Highland Park the clerks claim that Deming called asking for \$2 worth of merchandise and change for a \$20 bill. The goods was delivered and the man got the change, but told the clerk the \$20 would be turned over as soon as more goods were delivered. The man then disappeared before the clerk could get back. It was the identical game worked in all other cities along the north shore.

Deming is charged with operating a confidence game and was given a hearing Wednesday afternoon. Indications were that he would be bound over to the grand jury.

It is expected that the Kenosha victims will also attempt to identify Deming and that as soon as his case is disposed of in Highland Park, the Kenosha officers will re-arrest him on their charges.

Arrest Highwood Man on Judgment Execution

Louis Mazzetti of Highwood, whose auto ran into a carload of Highland Park young people several months ago, injuring all of them, was arrested a few days ago on a body execution issued by Judge Claire C. Edwards, for failure to pay a \$7,500 judgement won by Margaret Axt for injuries which she received in the accident, says the Waukegan News.

Begin Tax Collection on North Shore Monday

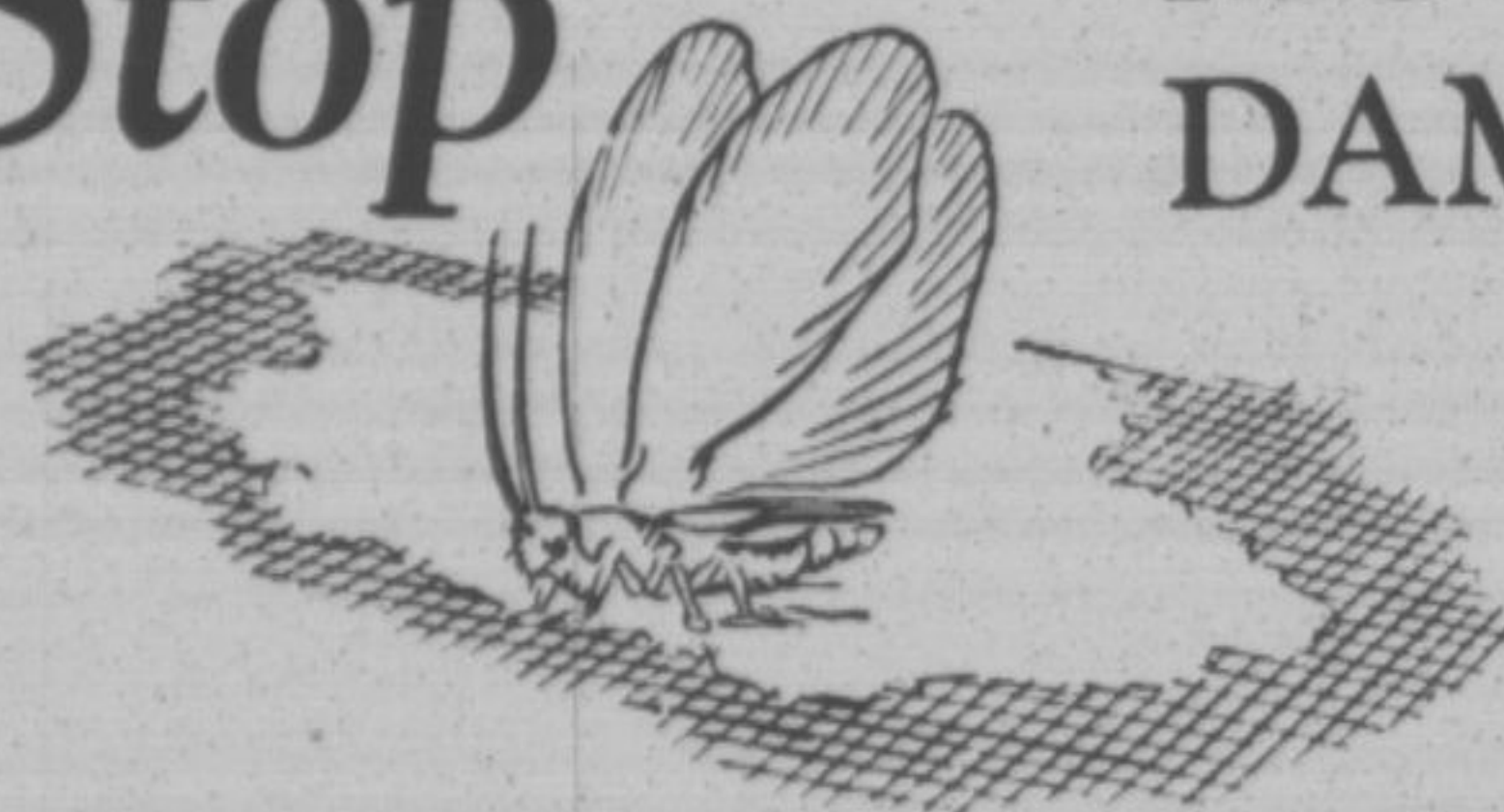
