Large Sums Expended

The North Shore Gas company has spent millions of dollars in the expansien of its properties in Waukegan and along the north shore during the past few years. The development of the section of the states which this concern serves has forced it to spend large sums in the extension of its system.

The work of expansion of the system has but begun in the opinion of officials of the corporation, however. With its lines being extended to all sections of the rapidly developing area along the north shore the company will be forced to spend large amounts in both the enlargement of its gas producing plant here and in its distributing system.

Practically all of the gas, that is being produced at the plant of the North Shore Coke and Chemical company owned and operated by the same interests that control the gas company. In addition to this the local plant of the gas company has been operating near capacity, all of which indicates the marked development in the business of this concern.

Local Plans Extensive

Plans for extensions to mains in Waukegan this year will be extensive as usual and several important changes will be made in the distribution system, it is declared.

While the commerce commission has not as yet acted upon the petition of the corporation for the authority to issue the large volume of stock it is expected that it will be granted at an early meeting of that body.


