### Funeral Services for Former Resident Mar. 6

William Herrmann, son of Mathias and Barbara (nee Selig) Herrman was born Aug. 24, 1863 at Deerfield, Illinois. His childhood years were spent there where he received his education in local schools and religious instruction at the St. Paul's Evangelical church.

In July 1891 Mr. Herrmann left Deerfield going to Chicago where he engaged in business retiring several years ago.

On Tuesday evening, March 4 Mr. Herrmann was struck by an automobile a short distance from his home and although rushed to the Garfield Park hospital the injuries sustained caused his immediate death.

Mr. Herrmann was active in charitable organization and church work. He was a member of the St. Paul's Evangelical church, Chicago, the German club of Chicago, and the Chicago Singverein.

Funeral services were held from Boland's chapel; thence to St. Paul's Evangelical church, Orchard and Temper streets, Chicago where the Rev. Jacob Pister conducted the services using as his text Mathew 7:24-25.
