#### **Believe Paid Killers** Murdered Girl in Deep Lake Cottage Mystery

Paid killers murdered the young woman whose charred body was found March 8 in the ruins of a Deep lake cottage, according to Pat Roche, in-Plan for the establishment of au- vestigator for States Attorney Swan-

> The killers are Chicagoans and one of them is known. Arrests are expected within a few days.

Sheriff Lawrence Doolittle is not surprised at the revelations made by Roche. The investigator, he said, started working on the case immediately and inquired into gang activities. Roche returned last week from a visit to the murder scene. He and his men searched the lake and dug in the vicinity of the cottage in the hope of locating the victim's missing

Scientific investigation, it was disclosed, has confirmed Mr. Roche's original theory about the killing. It was done in the cottage. The body was then dismembered and the cottage fired.

The discovery that the killers were taxes collected in Lake county will only carrying out the orders of other persons is believed to explain why the mystery has proved so baffling.

> The killers, Roche says, had a key they found in the ruins was not the one they used.
