**BEAT OLD RIVALS
52-15; FELL, HEINE
STAR IN 660 DASH**

**Deerfield-Shields Wins 15 Places
and Relay; Waukegan Gets
Seven Places**

Pulling several surprises and romping way ahead of the Waukegan lads in the dashes, the Deerfield-Shields junior tracksters easily copped the meet with the county seat boys by a score of 52½ to 15½. The field events, the 50-yard dash, and the 50-yard hurdles were held at Waukegan on Monday, while the rest of the runners did their stuff on our indoor track on Tuesday.

Tony Vignocchi sent the eight pound iron sphere for a 40' 1" ride. This is the longest distance that Tony has ever thrown the shot, and it is expected that he will reach the forty-five foot mark before the season is over. Cashmore gave his team-mates a real surprise when he threw the shot 39' 7½", without any previous practice.

Fred Fell ran the 660 in 1:40.2, the fastest junior indoor time that has been displayed in a long time.

A four lap relay team composed of Andrews, Zahnle, Getty, and Roy Worthington also broke all the records of "Deac's" former junior relay teams by running the distance in thirty-eight seconds. Two of the fellows, Andrews, and Zahnle, scarcely had any experience up to this time.

Heine put up a fast pace to beat out Roy Worthington for first place in the 50-yard dash.

George Ray easily out-jumped the Waukegan boys, and was seconded by King, another Deerfield-Shields high jumper.

It was Deerfield-Shields' meet from the start to the finish. All three places in the 660-yard run were won by Deerfield boys. Two firsts were allowed to Waukegan, while in the rest of the events, they only won a second or third summaries:

Shot put—Vignocchi (D) 1st; Cashmore (D) 2nd; Setrakian (W) 3rd. Distance forty feet one inch.

50-yard hurdles — Setrakian (W) 1st; Worthington (D) 2nd; Marder (D) 3rd. Time :7.01.

50-yard dash — Heine (D) 1st; Worthington (D) 2nd; Laurant (W) 3rd. Time :5.9.

High jump—Ray 1st; King (D) 2nd; Larson (W) 3rd. Height five feet two inches.

220-yard dash — Worthington (D) 1st; Heine (D), Getty (D), Warfel (W) tied for second. Time :29.

660-yard run—Fell (D) 1st; Rogers (D) 2nd; Selo (D) 3rd. Time 1:40.2.

Relay—Won by Deerfield (Andrews, Zahnle, Getty, Worthington). Time :38.

Pole Vault—Warfel (W) 1st; Atteridge (D) 2nd; Laurant (W) 3rd. Height nine feet.
