The Catalogue—A Key
 The Library catalogue is the key to the information locked away in unusual places by publishers, authors, and the makers of books. It is a card index, not primarily a record, but rather a working tool, which makes the connection between the reader and the book he wants, even if the author has used several names, pseudonymous or real, in his literary life.

In the dictionary catalogue, which is used in public libraries, the general arrangement of the cards is alphabetic by author, subject, and title, so that it is used as one would use a dictionary or encyclopedia. The aim of the catalogue is to interpret the resources of the library to the reader and help him to help himself.
